

## Action Items to the UN Security Council On Women's Participation in Peacebuilding in Burma and the Implementation and Enforcement of SC 1325

In order for SC 1325 to be meaningfully implemented for women from Burma, it is necessary to insist that the Security Council and General Assembly pass resolutions facilitating implementation of SC 1325 in the following ways:

1. To require UNIFEM and other UN agencies to specifically include women in exile from Burma in all SC 1325 enforcement or implementation plans including conferences, technical support, financial support, training and/or NGO grants
2. To request that country plans for the implementation of SC 1325 also specifically include women in exile from Burma in all SC 1325 enforcement or implementation plans including conferences, technical support, financial support, training and/or NGO grants
3. To include women representatives from exiled groups from Burma on the ASEAN Charter drafting committee
4. To grant temporary consultative status to women's leadership NGO's in conflict countries such as the Women's League of Burma
5. To acknowledge that SC 1325 requires the Security Council to provide heightened scrutiny to allegations of gender crimes including rape when considering actions under Chapter 7 Threat to Peace
6. Insure representation of women in exile from Burma at the United Nations and other relevant forums involved in networking and enforcement of SC 1325 and
7. To request that host countries cooperate with a) temporary passport/visas  
b) any other travel documents
